

" People are enthusiastic about homing pigeons but there isn't much difference between homing pigeons and feral pigeons. It just depends on whether they live in someone's loft as a captive pigeon or the local town square."

" The homing abilities of pigeons are legendary. We are still learning about how amazing these birds are. They can do basic maths, on a par with monkeys, and can distinguish real words from made up ones."

Perhaps the most famous war pigeon is Cher Ami, who in 1918 was awarded the French Croix de guerre medal, for delivering messages from an encircled battalion under heavy fire. Cher Ami was shot through the breast, blinded in one eye, and his right leg was only hanging on by a tendon by the time he delivered his messages."




Amazing technology Bionic hand can be updated with new gestures, anytime, anywhere

"Some rival bionic hands can be app-controlled, but Pollard said the ability to talk to a single device set the Nexus apart."




