Does a baby fear the sea?

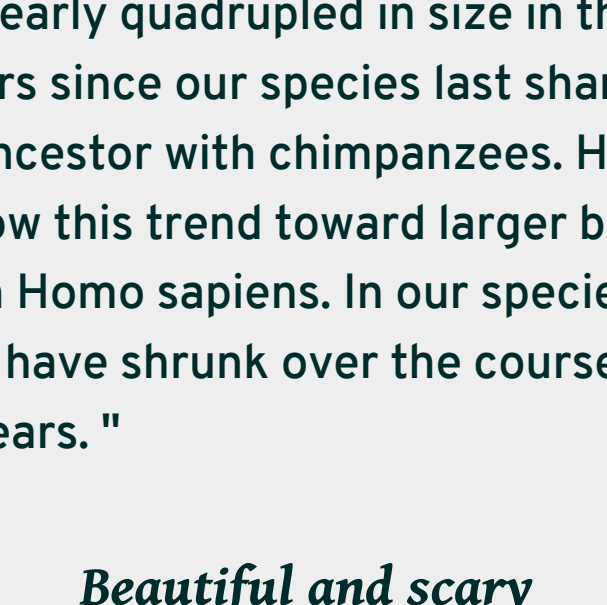
I loved to play

Probably not a problem

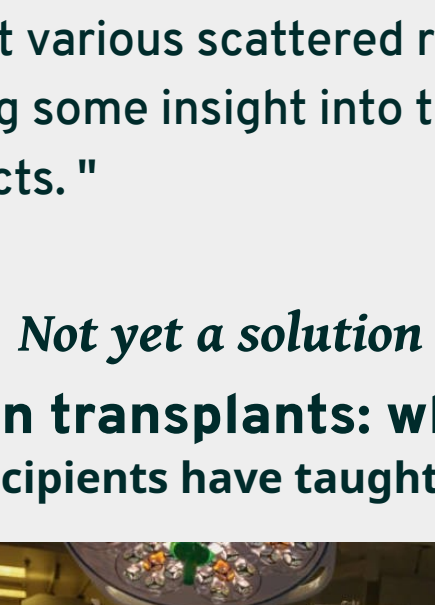
**The human brain has been shrinking –
and no-one quite knows why**



" Certainly, when compared with other animals of a similar size, our brains are gigantic. The human brain has nearly quadrupled in size in the six million years since our species last shared a common ancestor with chimpanzees. However, studies show this trend toward larger brains has reversed in Homo sapiens. In our species, average brain sizes have shrunk over the course of the last 100,000 years. "

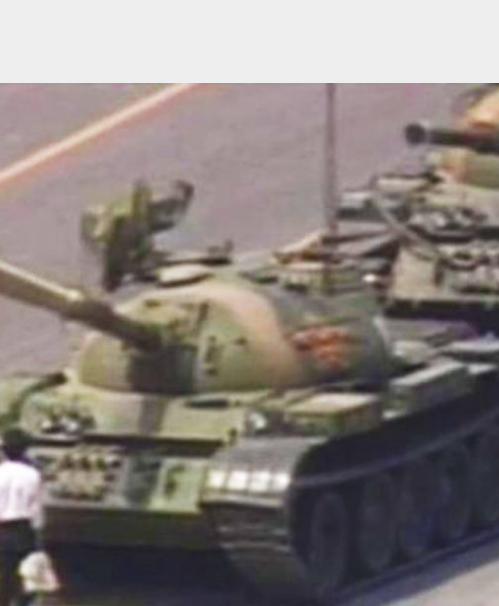
Strongest Solar Storm in 20 Years



" At present, it's difficult to say just how close we came to catastrophe because many companies—from grid controllers to satellite operators—do not like to reveal information on how a geomagnetic storm affected them, says Daniel Welling, a climate and space scientist at the University of Michigan. "They don't want to look like they're vulnerable," he says. "Satellite operators have to insure their spacecraft, and that can be very expensive." Yet various scattered reports are already offering some insight into the storm's disruptive effects. "

Pig-organ transplants: what three human recipients have taught scientists

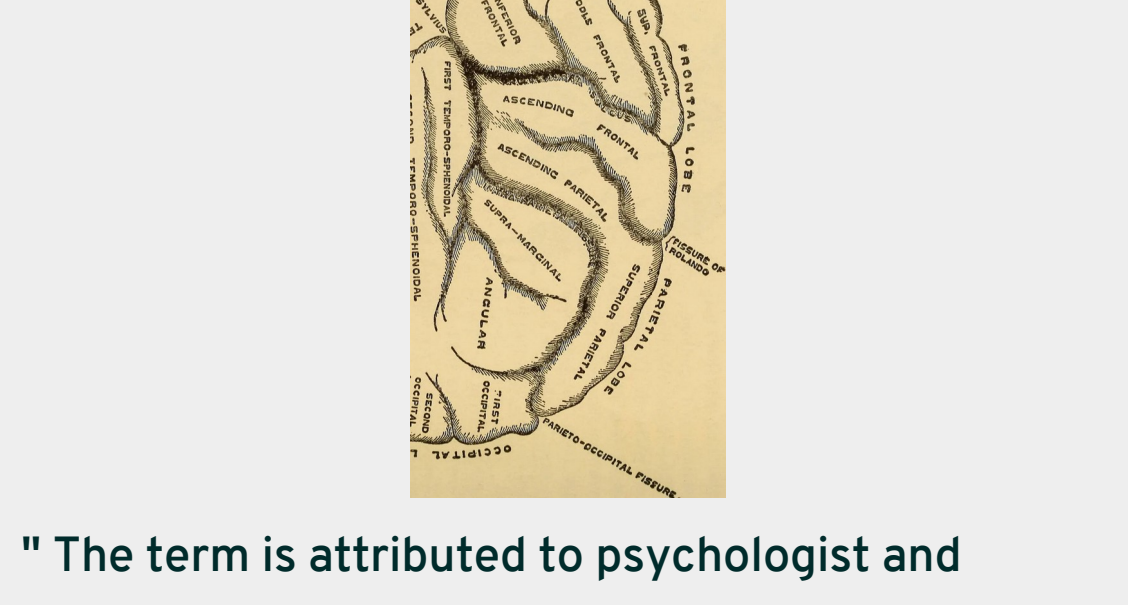

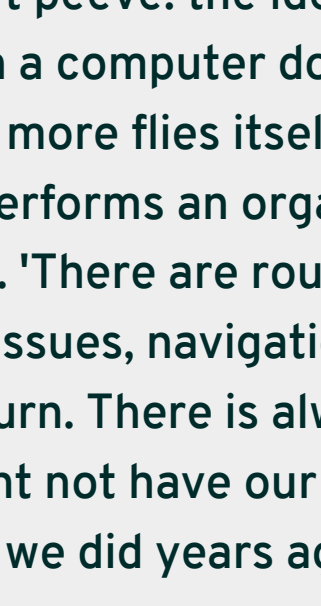

" Students began the hunger strike on 13 May, two days before the highly publicized state visit by Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev. Knowing that Gorbachev's welcoming ceremony was scheduled to be held on the square, student leaders wanted to use the hunger strike to force the government into meeting their demands. Moreover, the hunger strike gained widespread sympathy from the population at large and earned the student movement the moral high ground that it sought. By the afternoon of 13 May, some 300,000 were gathered at the square. "

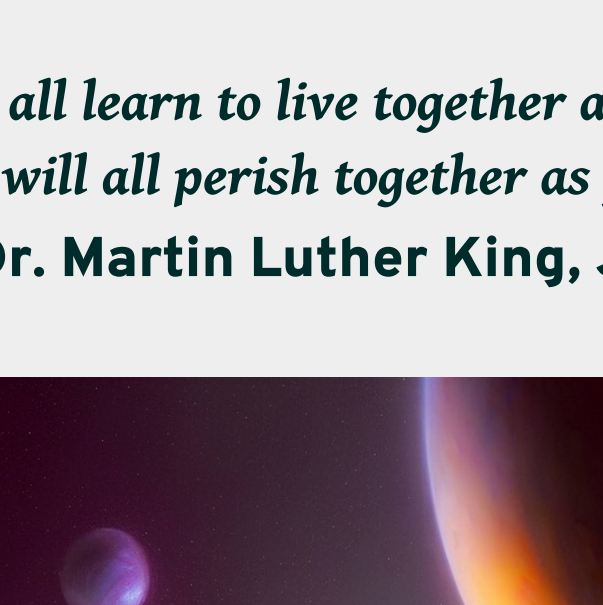


" The term is attributed to psychologist and eugenicist Henry H. Goddard, who used it to describe 'feeble-minded' individuals. "

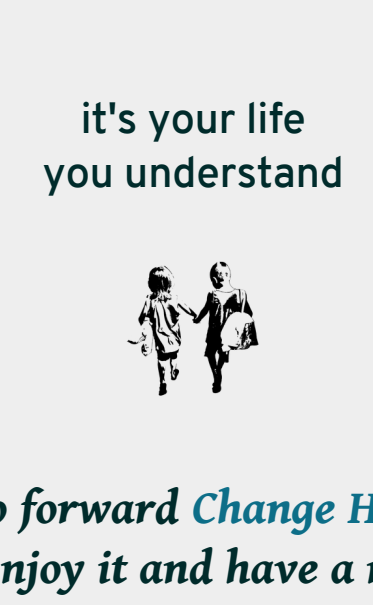
