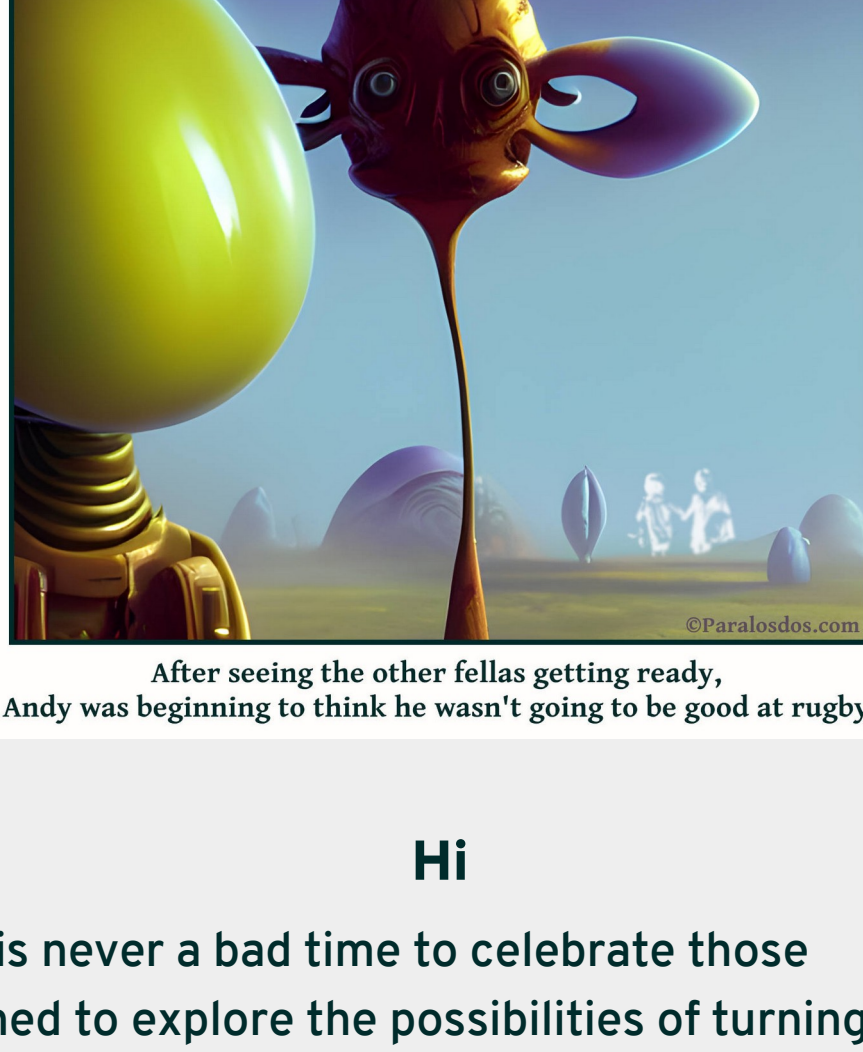

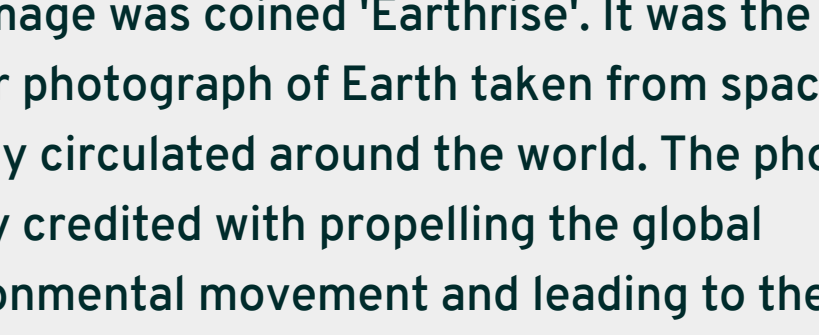
After seeing the other fellas getting ready, Andy was beginning to think he wasn't going to be good at rugby.

'Earthrise': The photo that sparked an environmental movement

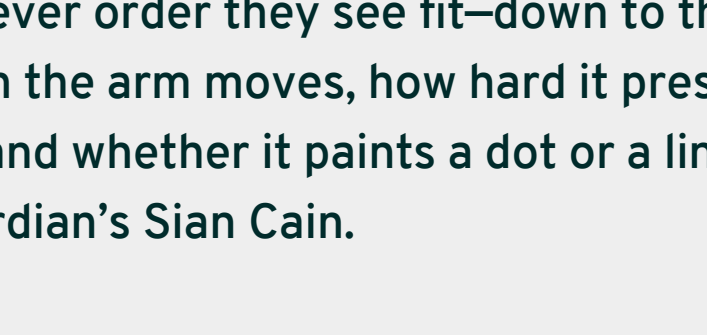


"That's a beautiful shot," said Lovell as he clicked the shutter and captured what has become one of the world's most famous photographs.

The image was coined 'Earthrise'. It was the first colour photograph of Earth taken from space and quickly circulated around the world. The photo is widely credited with propelling the global environmental movement and leading to the creation of Earth Day, an annual event promoting environmental activism and awareness, in 1970. "

These Robot Dogs Are Learning to Paint. Soon, You Can Watch Them Work

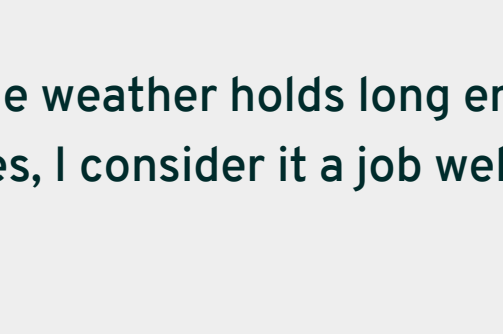

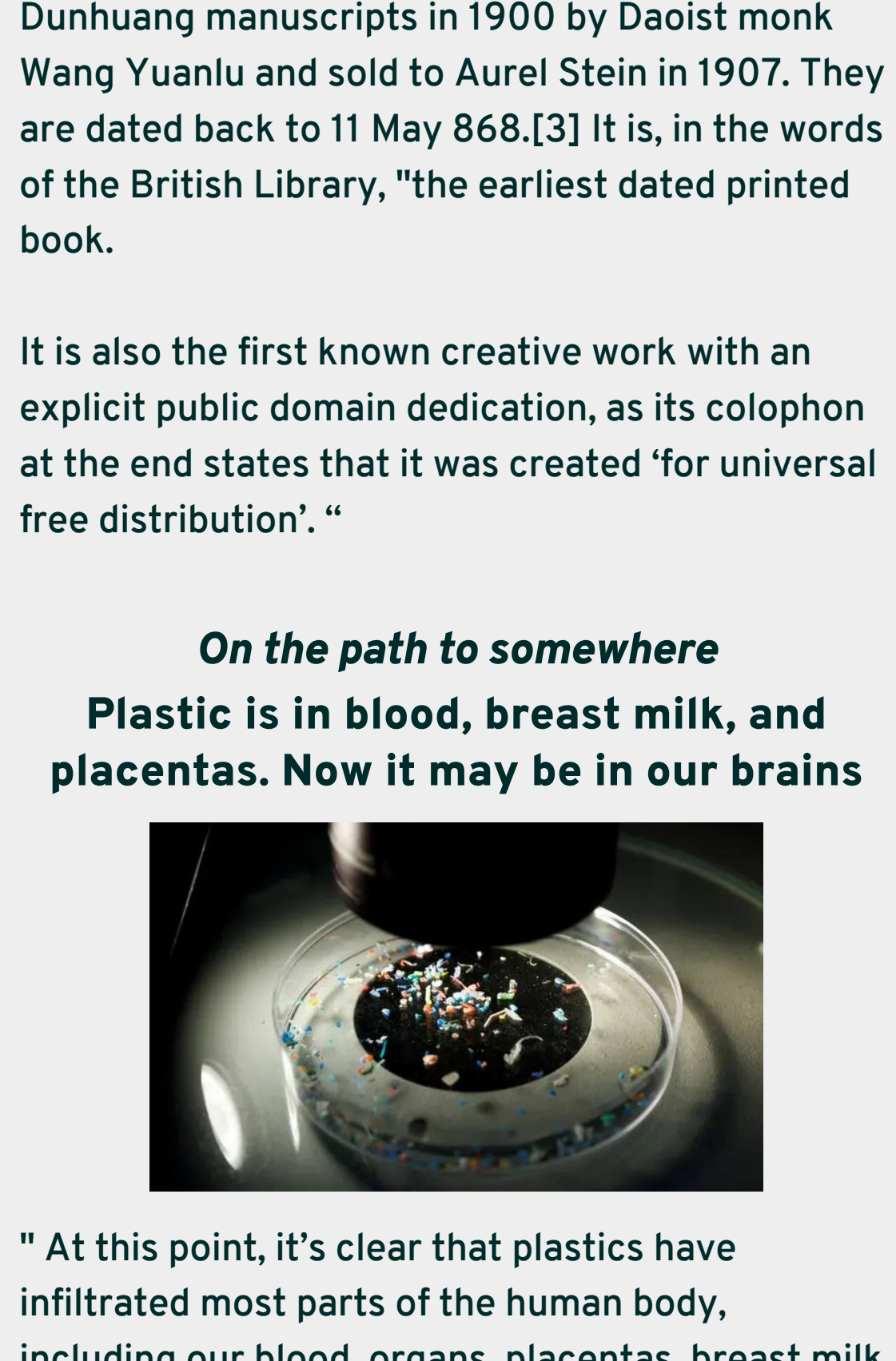

Earliest Dated Printed Book



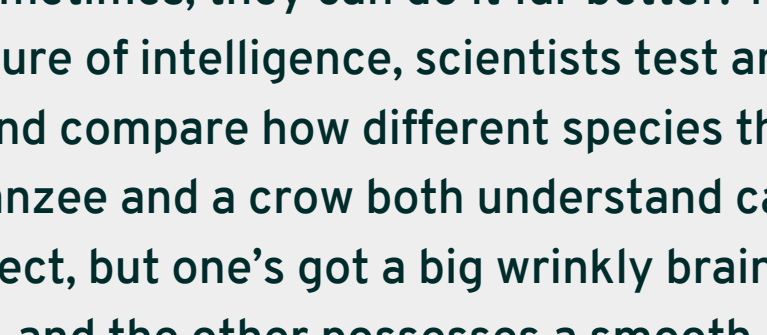

" A copy of the Tang dynasty–Chinese version of the Diamond Sūtra was found among the Dunhuang manuscripts in 1900 by Daoist monk Wang Yuanlu and sold to Aurel Stein in 1907. They are dated back to 11 May 868.[3] It is, in the words of the British Library, "the earliest dated printed book.

It is also the first known creative work with an explicit public domain dedication, as its colophon at the end states that it was created 'for universal free distribution'. "

On the path to somewhere

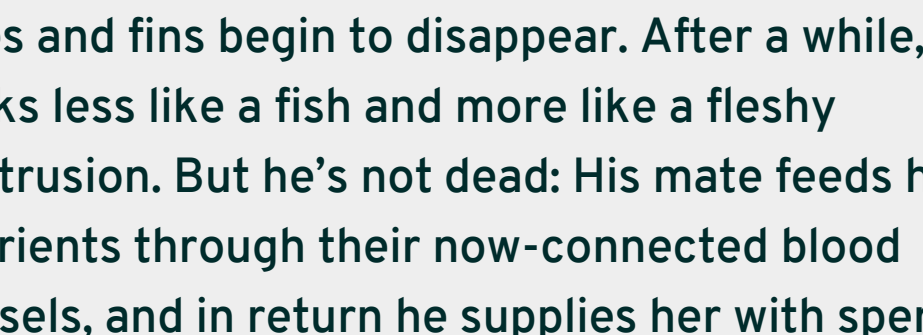
Plastic is in blood, breast milk, and placentas. Now it may be in our brains



" At this point, it's clear that plastics have infiltrated most parts of the human body, including our blood, organs, placentas, breast milk and gastrointestinal systems. While we don't yet fully understand how plastics affect different parts of our bodies, many chemicals found in various types of plastic are known carcinogens and hormone-disruptors, linked to negative health outcomes including obesity, diabetes, reproductive disorders and neurological impairments in fetuses and children. "

Smarter than we think

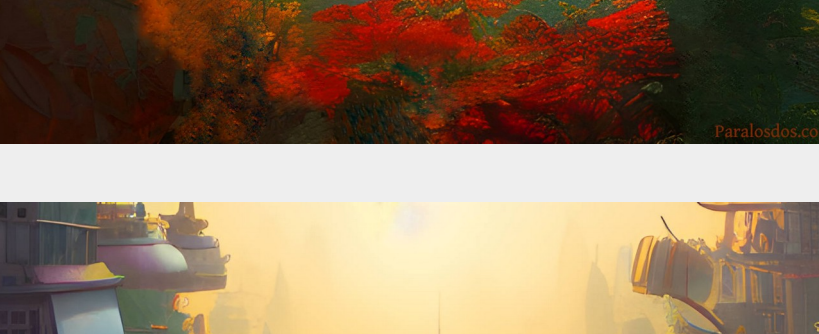
Creatures with skills that easily beat humans



" You think you're so smart. Well, a wave of research into animal cognition reveals that just about anything you do, other creatures can do too. Sometimes, they can do it far better. To probe the nature of intelligence, scientists test animal skills and compare how different species think. 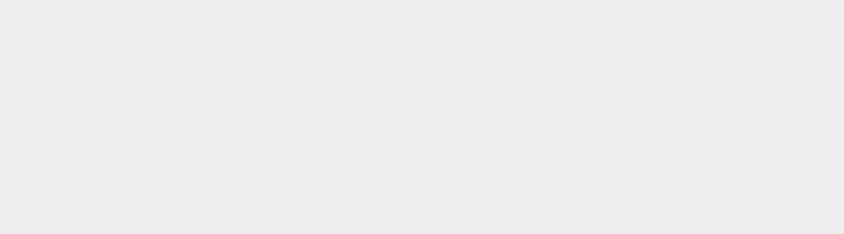
Facts You'll Wish You Had Never Learned
