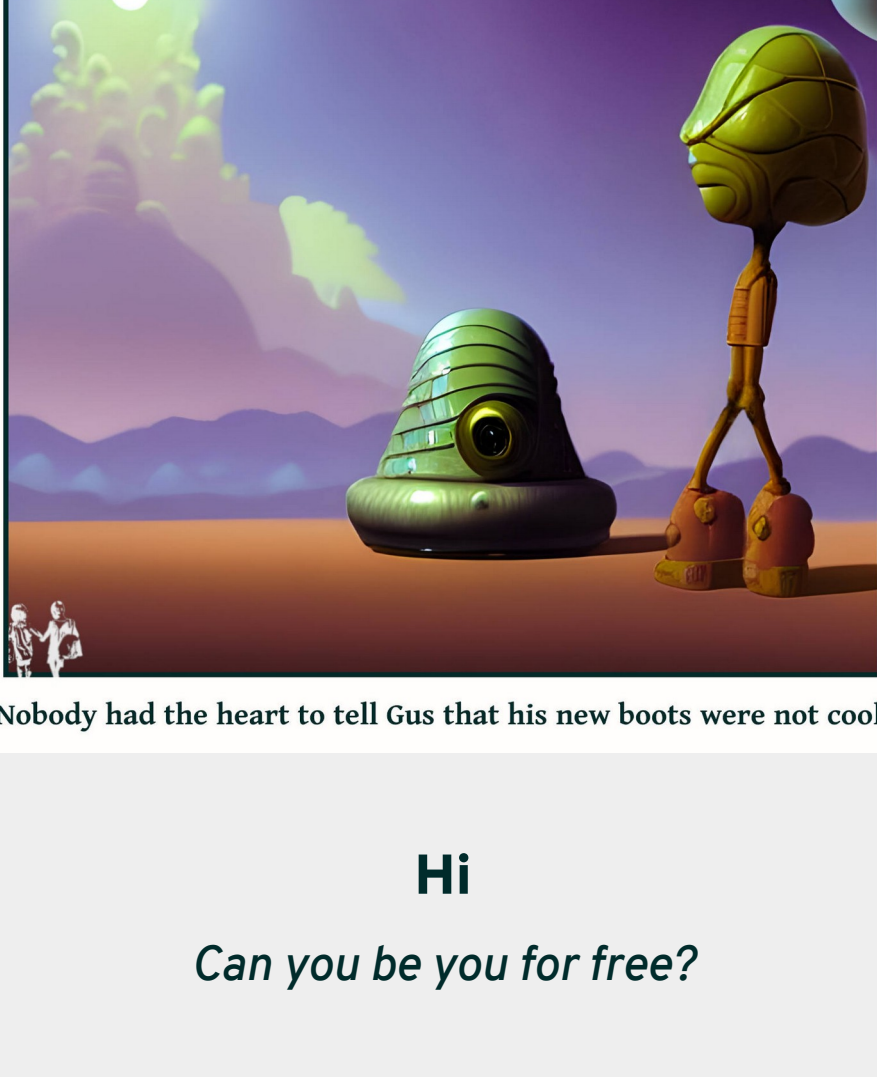

Imagine to begin every day by covering yourself without regard for convention or opinion.

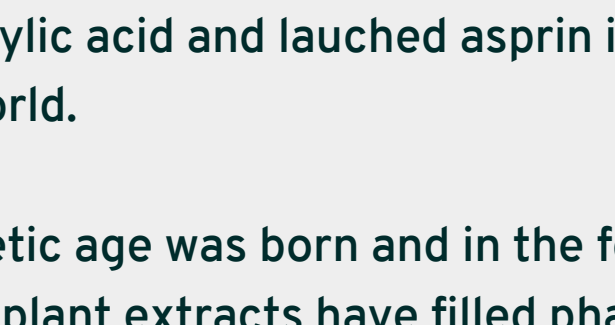
To represent, without filters, the finest, most exalted, vision of the nature of the you.

How long have people been using medicinal plants?

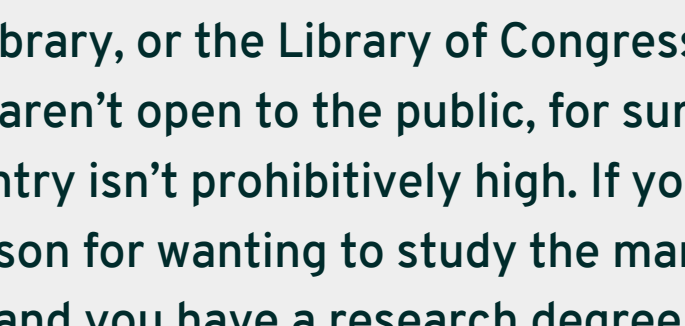


" In 1852, scientists were able to synthesize salicin, an active ingredient in willow bark, for the first time. By 1899, the drug company Bayer, modified salicin into a milder form of acetylsalicylic acid and launched aspirin into our modern world.

The synthetic age was born and in the following 100 years, plant extracts have filled pharmacy shelves. Although many medicines have been produced from plant extracts, chemists sometimes find that the synthetic versions do not carry the same therapeutic effects or may have negative side effects not found when using the whole plant source. "

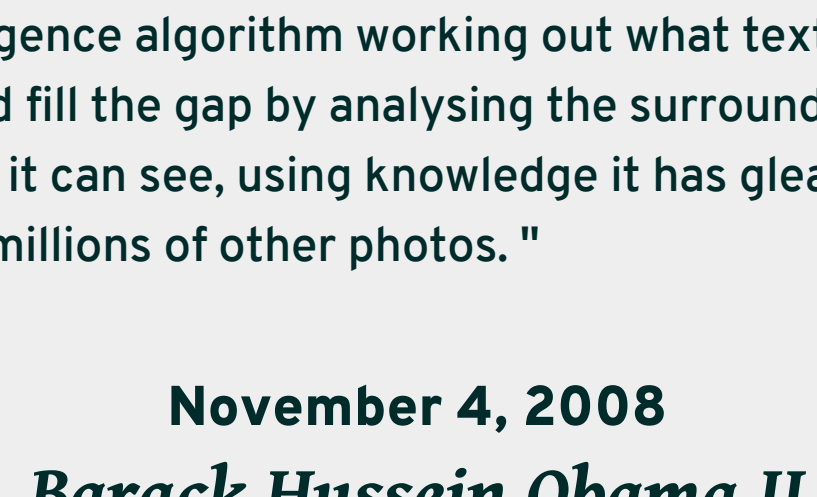
The Truth of the Vatican Secret Archives



" Honestly, it's not that exciting. Apart from the stringent initial security, the Vatican Archives work much the same as any other research archive. The procedure is almost identical in the British Library, or the Library of Congress. The archives aren't open to the public, for sure, but the bar for entry isn't prohibitively high. If you have a good reason for wanting to study the manuscripts in there, and you have a research degree to prove you can do it responsibly, it shouldn't be impossible for you to study what you want. "

Google Pixel's face-altering photo tool sparks AI manipulation debate

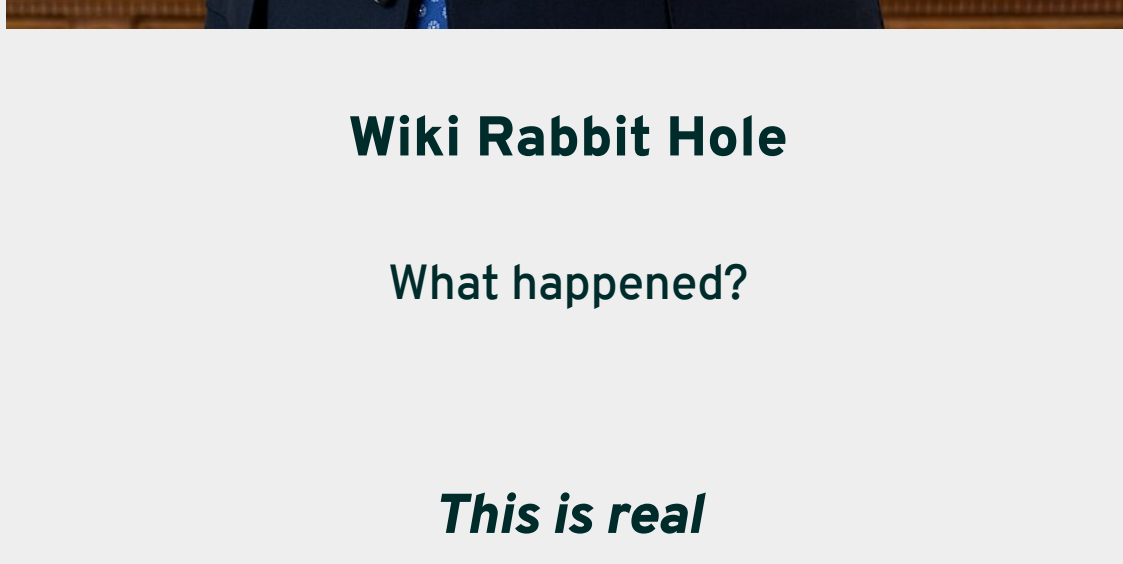


" The devices also let users erase, move and resize unwanted elements in a photo - from people to buildings - 'filling in' the space left behind with what's called Magic Editor. This uses what's known as deep learning, effectively an artificial intelligence algorithm working out what textures should fill the gap by analysing the surrounding pixels it can see, using knowledge it has gleaned from millions of other photos. "

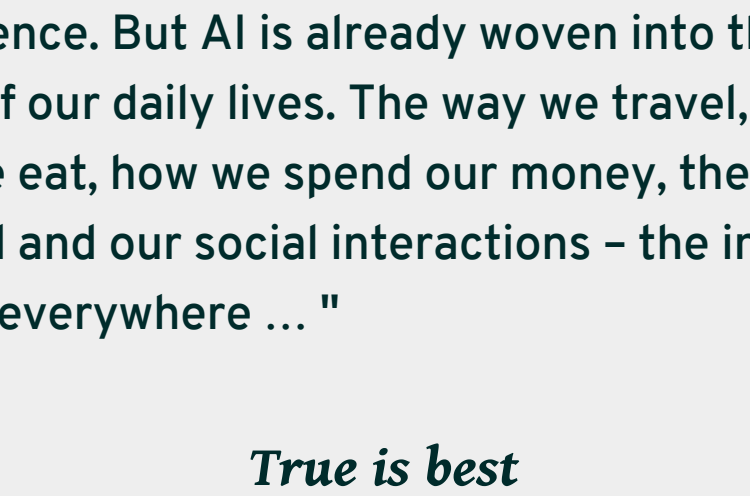

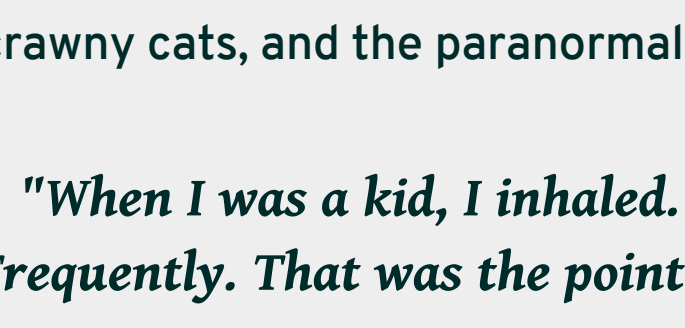

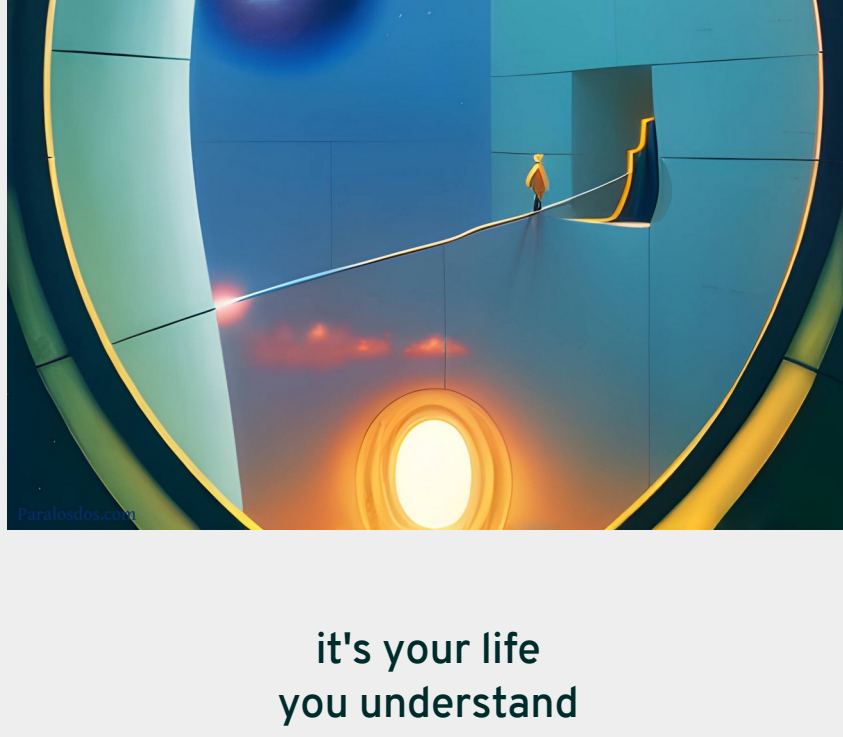
Creepiest Places You Should Probably Never Visit



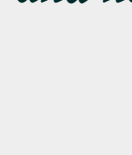
