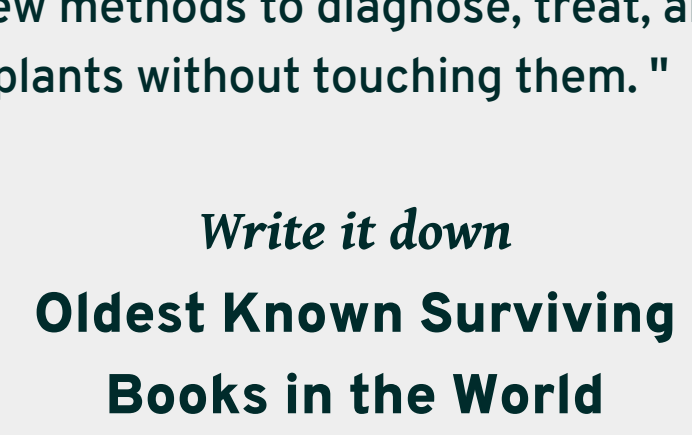
I reach back in time,

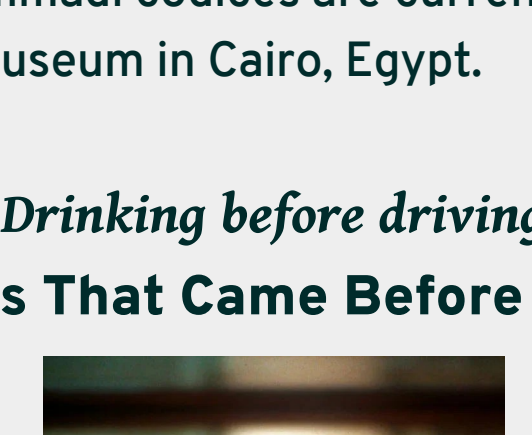
Plants can talk



" Researchers found that with special microphones that detect bat calls, you can hear plants, too. A wide range of species from tomatoes to cacti emit ultrasonic popping sounds when they're stressed that can be heard by insects like moths, and mammals like bats and mice. Scientists are listening to these sounds of distress to find new methods to diagnose, treat, and monitor plants without touching them. "

Oldest Known Surviving Books in the World



" Considered to be some of the oldest surviving bound books – 13 leather bound papyrus codices were discovered in 1945 buried inside a sealed jar, by a local man in the town of Nag Hammadi in Upper Egypt.

The books, containing Gnostic texts, are dated from around the first half of the 4th century AD. Written in the Coptic language, the codices are thought to have been copied from Greek. "

The Nag Hammadi codices are currently found at the Coptic Museum in Cairo, Egypt.

" Some archaeologists are starting to think that the world's first farmers domesticated grains to make beer, not bread. While the extent of alcohol's influence on human civilization is still debated, its antiquity is not. A short board was made up the harbor on the port tack, then coming off she stood to seaward, with her boom well out to port, and swung past the ferries with lively heels. A photographer on the outer pier of East Boston got a picture of her as she swept by, her flag at the peak throwing her folds clear. A thrilling pulse beat high in me. My step was light on deck in the crisp air. I felt there could be no turning back, and that I was engaging in an adventure the meaning of which I thoroughly understood. '

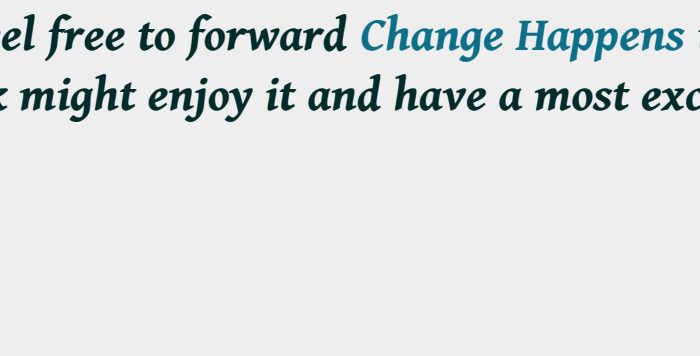
Oldest Musical Instruments in the World



" The three flutes found at the Geisenklösterle Cave archaeological site are the oldest instruments in the world. Two of the flutes are made from the bones of mute swans and the other flute is made from mammoth ivory. Researchers have radio carbon dated the flutes and estimate that they are between 42,000 and 43,000 years old artifacts. "

Hurricanes never cross the equator



" Here are four things about hurricanes that you may not know.

One: They're the local name of a global phenomenon. Large tropical storms in the western part of the Pacific Ocean are called typhoons. In the Indian Ocean, they're called cyclones. In the North Atlantic or the eastern part of the Pacific, they're hurricanes. The term "tropical cyclones" is often used as a catch-all term. "

Deadliest animals to humans

" When you think of deadly and dangerous animals, what springs to mind? It is likely big, carnivorous, apex predators, such as lions, wolves, or sharks.

What you will learn from this list of deadliest animals however is that size and strength can be deceiving. Sharks, although often unjustly perceived as very deadly, do not even make this list, being responsible for only six human deaths a year on average. Lions? Only 22. "
