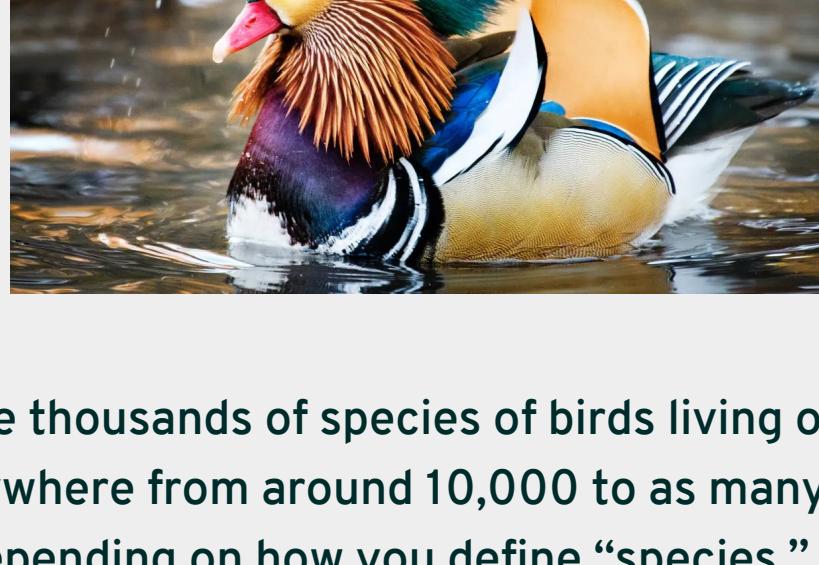
How close is a memory to reality?

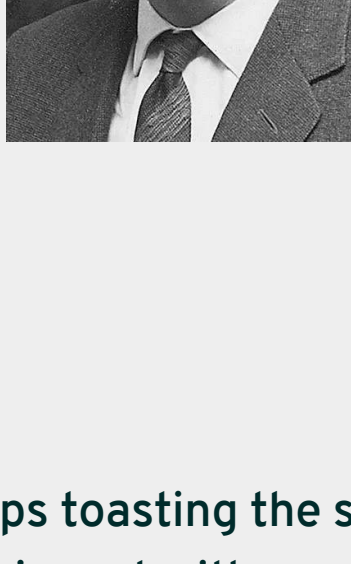
Why are there so many birds?



" There are thousands of species of birds living on Earth today—anywhere from around 10,000 to as many as 18,000, depending on how you define “species.” The fossil record suggests that almost all of this feathered, flying diversity emerged in the aftermath of the last major extinction 66 million years ago, when an asteroid rocked the planet and drove the non-avian dinosaurs extinct. Only a few birds—chicken, ostrich, and duck-like creatures—made it across the extinction line, giving rise to the dizzying array of modern birds: From songbirds to corvids to parrots. "

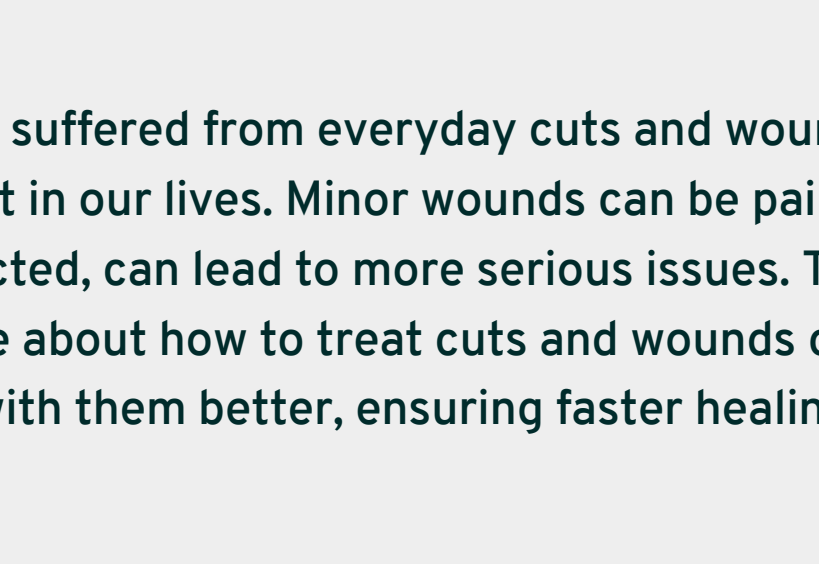
The Inventor of Ibuprofen Tested the Drug on His Own Hangover

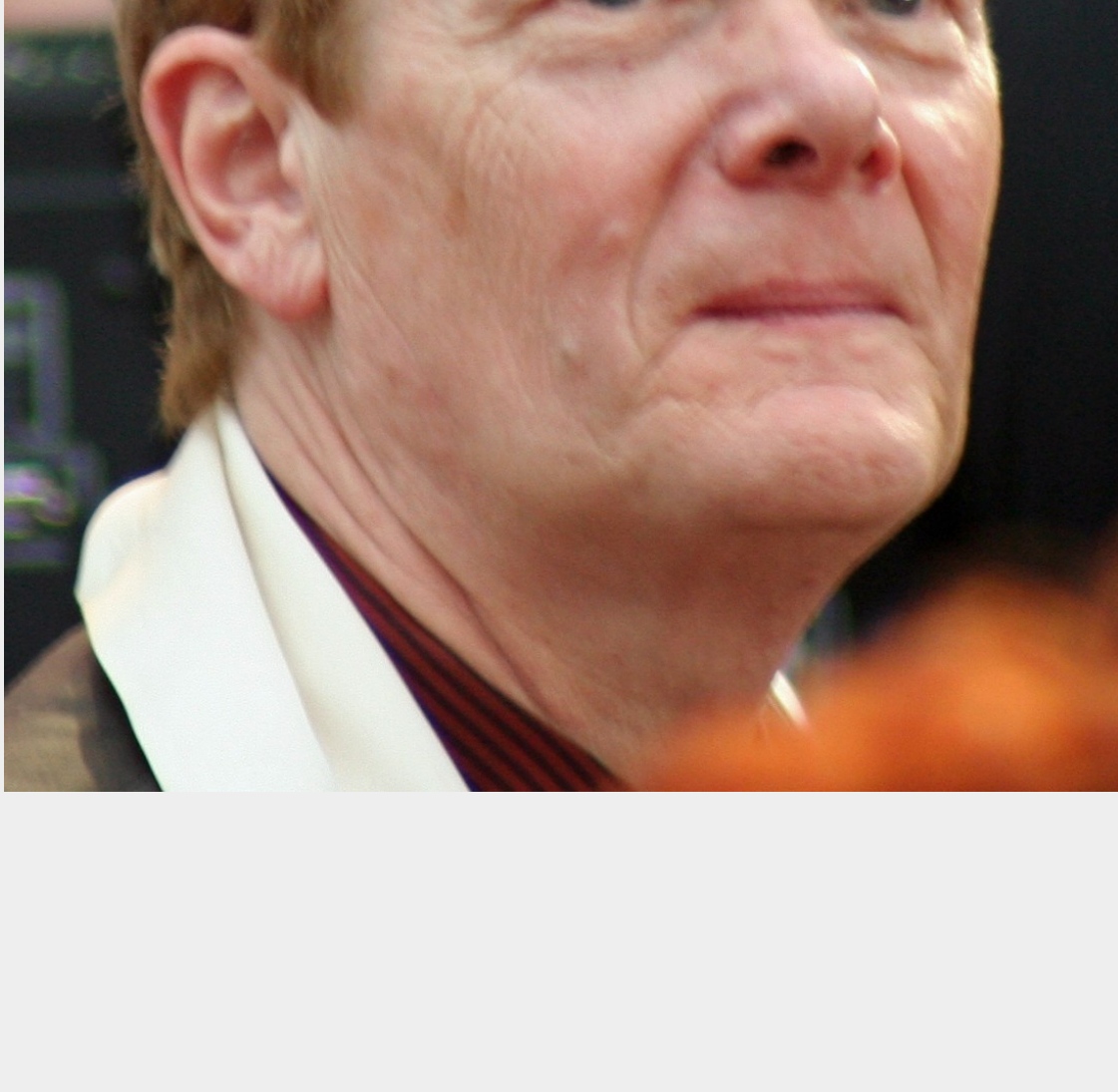

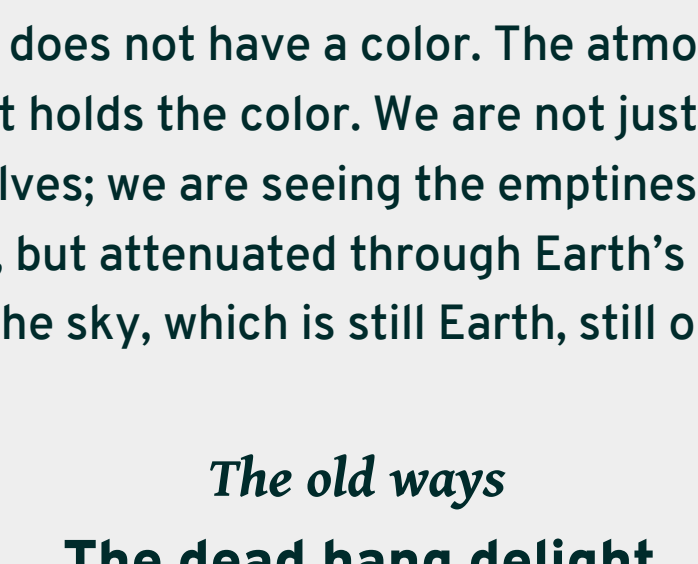

" Petit became known to New Yorkers in the early 1970s for his frequent tightrope-walking performances and magic shows in the city parks, especially Washington Square Park. Petit's most famous performance was in August 1974, conducted on a wire between the roofs of the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in Lower Manhattan, New York City, 400 metres (1,312 feet) above the ground. The towers were still under construction and had not yet been fully occupied. He performed for 45 minutes, making eight passes along the wire, during which he walked, danced, lay down on the wire, and saluted watchers from a kneeling position. Office workers, construction crews and policemen cheered him on. "

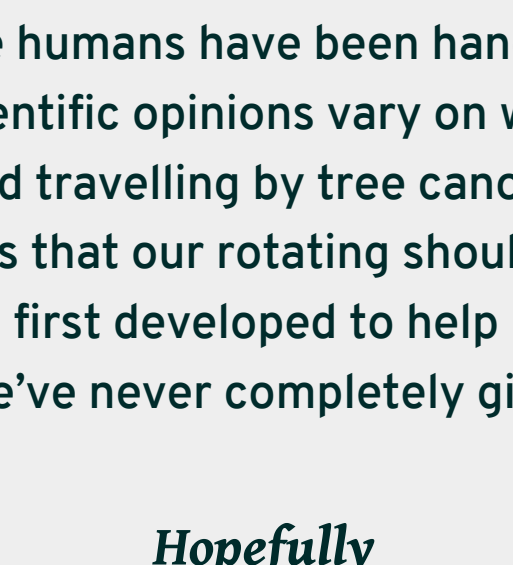
Trees don't like to breathe wildfire smoke, either

The old ways

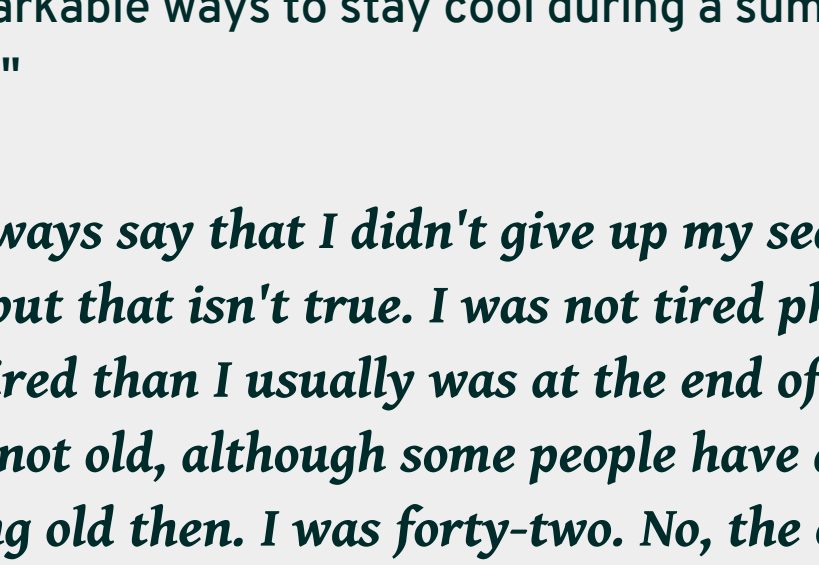
The dead hang delight

Ways People Kept Cool Before Air Conditioning



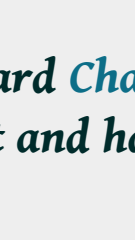
